In a stiff three-way competition amongst Malaysia, Kuwait and South Korea, Squash Racquets Association of Malaysia's (SRAM's) President was favoured as the new President to lead Asian squash for the next four (4) years till January 2013.

ASF was formed in 1980 and currently has 27 member nations out of 44 countries forming the Asian region. Under Dato' Sani's leadership, ASF would progressively pursue and activate the remaining 17 countries in trying to expand the sport's popularity in Asia and to take it to the Olympics of 2016, with Malaysia's own athletes in the lead.

The ASF Secretariat is now based in Kuala Lumpur, adjacent to SRAM's office at the National Squash Complex. All are WELCOME.

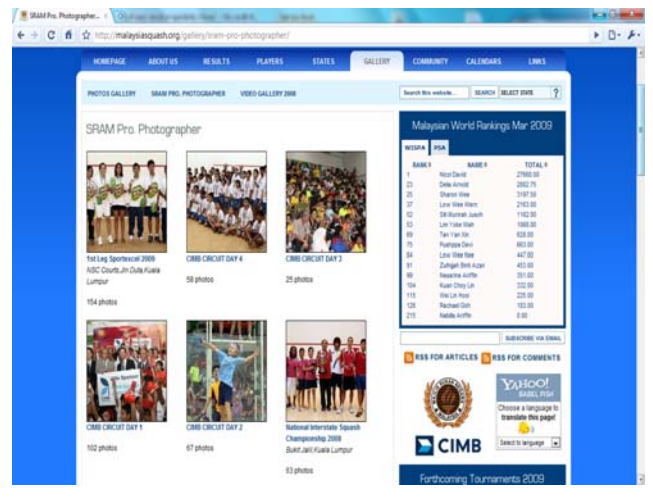

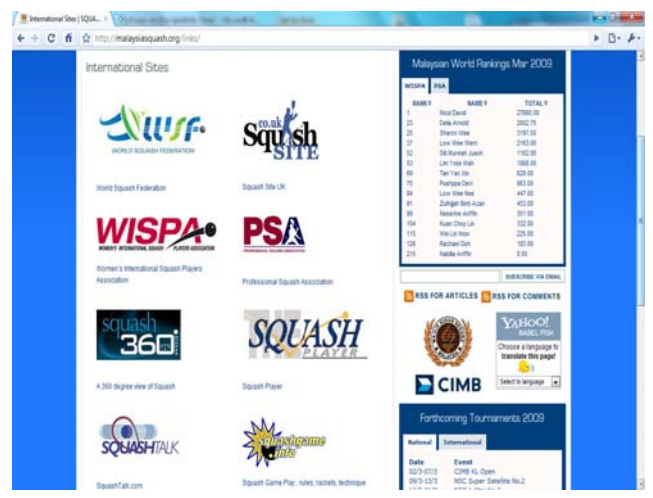
